


<b>Key Learning Areas</b>	<p><b>Retelling stories from other cultures</b></p> <p>Students will listen to, read, view and interpret picture books and stories, including a wide selection from different cultures, to retell a favourite story in writing to an audience of peers.</p>  <p>Handwriting using Queensland script, spelling and reading are taught and monitored throughout the English program</p>	<p><i>This term students will:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>investigate, explore and describe patterns in number including partitioning and the use of number lines</li> <li>skip count by twos, fives, and tens</li> <li>explore the relationship between addition and subtraction</li> <li>Using units of measurement — compare and measure lengths using uniform informal units, order objects based on length, explore capacity, measure capacity using uniform informal units, order objects based on capacity</li> <li>Locate numbers on a number line</li> <li>Count to 100</li> <li>Partition numbers using place value</li> </ul> 	<p><b>Changes around me</b></p> <p>In this unit, students compare the changes that occur in the sky and landscape. They make links to how the changes affect their experiences.</p> <p>Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>compare observations of the day sky and landscape with the night sky and landscape</li> <li>examine changes that occur in the sky and landscape</li> <li>reflect on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander explanation of observable changes in the sky and landscape</li> <li>formulate links with changes that occur in the sky and landscape to experiences in everyday life.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Respectful Relationships</b></p> <p>This unit will have a strong focus on social and emotional development. Students will learn how to identify and label emotions whilst being encouraged to make appropriate behaviour choices in different social situations. Students will role play various scenarios to promote positive friendships, behaviours and attitudes.</p>	<p>This term the focus in weekly PE specialist sessions will be to develop:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>racquet skills</li> <li>kicking skills</li> <li>the skills required to actively participate in sports day events which involve running, jumping, throwing, ball games and relays.</li> </ul> <p>Of course, the overriding focus on all lessons will be to have FUN!</p> 	<p><b>DRAMA</b></p> <p>Students devise, perform and respond to drama by acting out an event from picture book.</p>  <p><b>Music</b></p> <p>Weekly music lessons will be conducted by our Music Specialists. Students will learn about Beat using fast/slow descriptors, and also how to distinguish between Beat and Rhythm. Students will perform various Beat and Rhythm combinations using Percussion instruments. In-Tune singing will also be a focus this term.</p> 	<p><b>. Operation: Animal Rescue!</b></p> <p><i>HELP! Native Australian animals have been rescued from recent floods. Now that they are feeling better, your challenge is to return them to their habitat as soon as possible.</i></p> <p>Students will learn about digital systems and how they solve problems.</p> <p>They will use algorithms to program a BeeBot to return the native animals to their habitats.</p>
