This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students attaining a B standard or above in English and Mathematics.
- Improve literacy and numeracy achievement of all students in the core areas of English (Reading, Writing, Spelling) measured by a range of assessment tools.
- Maintain the percentage of students achieving at or beyond the National Minimum Standards for Year 3 and 5 in NAPLAN Reading, Writing, Spelling and Numeracy at a level similar to the nation
- Lift the percentage of students achieving in the NAPLAN Upper Two Bands to 'similar' when compared to 'like schools'

Our initiatives include

- Employing a Pedagogy teacher to take a lead role in the development of consistency in pedagogy.
- Building M1 moderation processes for all Year Level teams to build capacity of teaching staff and embed as an organisation routine of school wide professional learning and development.
- Employment of teacher aide to support classroom teachers to deliver a differentiated model of targeted teaching in numeracy and literacy.
- Implementing a data wall for English across all year levels to inform action/support.
- Implementing quality, targeted professional development programs that align with the school priority area of Australian Curriculum (reading & writing)
- Providing evidence based, data driven, early intervention programs to lift student achievement in the core areas of English (Reading, Writing, Spelling)
- Increasing support to deliver targeted teaching in literacy and numeracy as a part of the Learning Support & Enrichment program
